

RESOLUTION NO. 2019-443

A RESOLUTION DECLARING VALID, MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 2019-01, OF THE SANGGUNIANG BAYAN OF ALANGALANG, LEYTE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 468 (a)(1)(i) of Republic Act 7160 otherwise known as The Local Government Code of 1991, among the powers and duties of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan is "to review all ordinances approved by the Sanggunians of component cities and municipalities;"

WHEREAS, MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 2019-01, of the Sangguniang Bayan of Alangalang, Leyte, entitled: "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE USE OF PLASTIC BAGS IN THE COMMERCIAL ESTABLISHMENTS IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF ALANGALANG, LEYTE AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF," was submitted to the Sangguniang Panlalawigan for approval;

WHEREAS, the Provincial Legal Office was requested to review and submit recommendation on the subject Ordinance pursuant to Section 481 (3) (vii) of R.A. 7160;

WHEREAS, the Provincial Legal Office through Atty. Faye Gladys M. Tebrero, Acting Assistant Provincial Legal Officer, in an Indorsement dated August 8, 2019, recommended for the declaration of its validity pursuant to Section 56 (c) of R.A. 7160, the same being an exercise of the power essential to the promotion of the General Welfare, Health and Safety, and enhance the right of the people to a Balanced Ecology, authorized under Section 16 of the Code;

WHEREAS, the August Body, upon review and recommendation of the Provincial Legal Office, finds the subject Ordinance in conformity with existing laws, rules and regulations;



RESOLUTION NO. 2019-077-A

WHEREAS, Article II, Section 6 of the Philippine Constitution provides that the state shall provide and advance the right of the people to a balanced and healthful ecology in accord with the rhythm and harmony with nature:

WHEREAS, Section (1) of R.A. 7160 also known as the Local Government Code of 1991 provides that the Local Government Unit shall share the National Government the responsibility in the management and maintenance of ecological balance within their territorial jurisdiction.

WHEREAS, Section 477 (vi) of R.A. 7160 also empowers the Sangguniang Bayan to protect the environment and impose appropriate penalties for acts which endanger the environment including such activities which result in pollution, acceleration or eutrophication of rivers and lakes or ecological imbalance.

WHEREAS, plastic bags are rampantly used ad packaging materials not only in the Municipality of Alangalang, Leyte but also in other parts of the country. Being non-bio degradable material, plastic bags clog our canals, creeks, rivers and other waterways.

WHEREAS, despite serious efforts of the municipality to segregate compostable, recyclable and reusable materials, plastic and other materials remain in the waste stream and other waterways.

WHEREAS, the municipality of Alangalang in its desire to reduce if not totally eliminate the use of plastic film bags as packaging materials, encourages the utilization of alternative packaging materials such as Eco bags, woven bags (Bayong), cloth bag (katsa), woven baskets, paper bags, manila paper (no print), bamboo strip (Banban) and other similar materials. Consumers are encouraged to bring their own containers (enumerated above) or recyclable materials for the purpose.

Page-2-(Resolution No. 2019-077-A/Municipal Ordinance No. 2019-01) (June 17, 2019)

WHEREAS, there is an urgent need to regulate the use of plastic bags to prevent potential serious ecological imbalance particularly the clogging and pollution of the municipality's canals, creeks, rivers and other waterways.

WHEREFORE, on motion of SB Member Lovell Anne M. Yu, duly seconded by SB Member Oscar N. Matela, be it –

RESOLVED as it is hereby resolved that this resolution be enacted into Municipal Ordinance, to wit.

MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE NO. 2019-01

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE USE OF PLASTIC BAGS IN THE COMMERCIAL ESTABLISHMENTS IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF ALANGALANG, LEYTE AND PROVING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.

Be it ordained in session assembled, that:

SECTION 1. Title

This ordinance shall be known as "Plastic bag use regulatory ordinance"

SECTION 2. Definition of Terms

For purposes of this ordinance, the following terms are defined as follows:

- a.) Dry goods refer to any product that does not require refrigeration freezing to maintain freshness such as textiles, clothing and other products that may not produce juice when packed.
- b.) Plastic bags also known as sando bags, pouch, plastic shopping bags and plastic film bags. It is a type of flexible packaging material made of thin, plastic film that is used for containing and transporting food and other products (commercial or industrial). It shall also refer to thin-gauge packaging medium that is used as bags or wraps.
- c.) Plastic waste refers to any plastic packaging material thrown as waste.
- d.) Primary packaging materials refer to those types of packaging for containing wet produce, snack foods, frozen foods, hardware and other products.
- e.) Secondary packaging materials refers to those types of packaging materials for wet goods to provide support to any primary packaging.
- f.) Wet goods Fish and meat products.
- g.) Bio-degradable packaging materials refer to packaging materials made of wooden or bamboo materials, pandan, clean manila paper (no print) and other similar materials.

SECTION 3. Prohibition of the Use of Plastic Bags on Dry Goods.

No person or business establishment shall utilize bags as packaging materials on dry goods every Tuesday for the first 6 months of implementation, adding one day of its implementation every after 6 months.

SECTION 4. Regulating the Use of Plastic Bags on Wet Goods.

No person or business establishment dealing on wet goods shall use plastic bags as secondary packaging materials every Tuesday for the first 6 months of implementation.

SECTION 5. Disposal of Plastic Wastes

Plastic bags or other similar plastic waste materials shall be discarded only at the collection area of the barangay. The aforementioned waste materials must be cleaned and dried prior to submission to their respective barangays for proper collection. and disposal

SECTION 6 Monitoring

The Municipal Mayor shall designate an officer who shall monitor the effective implementation of this ordinance. The designated officer shall prepare a semi-annual report on the progress of the implementation of this ordinance.

SECTION 7. Information Education and Communication Campaign.

Upon approval of this ordinance, the municipality shall conduct massive information education and communication campaigns and shall also include the promotion of alternative biodegradable materials and encourage the utilization of alternative packaging materials such as Eco Bags, woven Bags (Bayong), cloth bags (katsa), woven baskets, paper bags, Manila papers (no print), bamboo strip (banban) and other similar materials. Consumers are enjoined to bring their own containers (enumerated above) or recyclable materials for the purpose.

SECTION 8. Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR)

Within thirty (30) days from the approval of this ordinance, the necessary implementing rules and regulations shall be issued by the Municipal Mayor for the proper and effective implementation of this ordinance.

SECTION 9. Moratorium

All business establishment and/or individuals are hereby given Ninety (90) moratorium from the date this ordinance is effective to strictly comply with provision hereof.

SECTION 10. Implementation

This ordinance shall be implemented upon approval of the reviewing body and after completion of required publication of posting.

SECTION 11. Penalties

Any person or business establishment who shall violate this ordinance shall punished through the imposition of the following penalties:

First offense Second offense Third and succeeding offenses Fine of P500.00 Fine of P1,000.00 Fine of P2.500.00 or

revocation of business permit

SECTION 12. Repealing Clause - This Ordinance repeals any ordinance or parts thereof which are inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

SECTION 13. **Separability Clause** – Any section or provisions of this ordinance, or any part thereof, or the application of such section, provision as portion is declared unconstitutional or invalid, the remainder thereof shall not be affected by such declaration.

SECTION 14. Effectivity Clause – This Ordinance shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its approval by authorities concerned.

MINUTES OF THE PUBLIC HEARING IN THE PROPOSED ORDINANCE OTHERWISE KNOWN AS "REGULATING THE USE OF PLASTIC BAGS IN THE COMMERCIAL ESTABLISHMENTS IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF ALANGALANG, LEYTE AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF" HELD AT THE ALANGALANG COVERED COURT ON NOVEMBER 15, 2018.

Present during the public hearing were members of the Sangguniang Bayan, Barangay Officials, market stall owners and vendors, PNP personnel, SB Member Lovell Anne M. Yu, Principal author of the proposed ordinance, presiding.

SB Member Lovell Anne M. Yu explained the logic behind the proposal in ensuring a more pro-active approach to waste disposal in compliance to environmental laws.

SPO2 Noel Catindoy, expressed that since the PNP is tasked to support the enforcement of the proposed ordinance, he asked if a person using a plastic bag be apprehended. SB Member Lovell Anne M. Yu replied that the ordinance focuses on commercial establishments using plastic bags. However, the PNP personnel may ask the person in possession of a plastic as to what establishment is using plastic as a form of packaging.

Ms. Luzviminda Quimpan said that the regulation on plastic use is an advantage to their business since they will no longer be providing plastic bags to customers.

SB Member Lovell Yu said that LGU-Alangalang will initiates information dissemination all throughout the barangays to educate the community folks on the necessity to reduce plastic wastes.

Ms. Emma Caones, Market Supervisor disclosed that in the Municipality of Palompon, they are using papers bags as an alternative to plastic bags. Ms. Caones said that in the same manner, we will be able to help clean the environment.

SB Member Lovell Anne M. Yu asked for some questions. Ms. Caones suggested to give a moratorium by implementing only for one day of every week until the use of plastic bags is totally eliminated.

SB Member Yu said that upon enactment of the proposed ordinance, an information and education campaign has to be launched. She will also discuss the proposed ordinance with the Punong Barangays during the ABC meeting.

Mr. Mark Tado suggested to penalize any person using plastic bags like in Northern Samar.

SB Member Lovell Yu said that the suggestion will be included in the consideration of the proposed ordinance during the Sangguniang Bayan's plenary.

There having no further discussion, the public hearing adjourned at 11:30 in the morning.
